Justin Luba Enosa, 23 years old, is a Primary School teacher at M-3 Modern Nursery, Primary and Secondary School in Jondoki, a suburb of Juba, the capital city of South Sudan, after graduating in 2023 from Solidarity Teachers Training College (STTC).

“I liked my time at STTC because while there, I gained a lot of knowledge, my self-confidence was built, and I got the momentum in life that I needed. The academic aspect was the best part of the college, including how the lessons were delivered and how the tutors nurtured and turned us into teachers. For example, Sr. Jacinta inspired us to be creative teachers. We have to create teaching aids using resources from our immediate environment to make the lessons enjoyable for the learners. This is what I have been doing for my students. They enjoy the classes and understand what I teach them better.”





“In addition to using teaching aids, at Solidarity, they taught us how to prepare a lesson plan, which a professional teacher must use daily. We use it as a guide to what content to deliver, how to organize it, how to communicate it and how to assess the students. The scheme of work is connected to lesson plans. You cannot prepare a lesson plan without a scheme of work, which is a long-term plan for what you intend to teach. With such preparation, it is easy to teach with confidence.”

“I studied for my Certificate in Primary Education in Solidarity and Diploma in another teacher training college. There is a big difference in the quality of education I got from the two colleges. I am a better teacher because of Solidarity in comparison to other teachers who did not get trained by them.”
